1. Title of the Practice (2022-23)

Health awareness programme

- **2. Goal:** Health is an asset that helps us to maintain the balance between the life and the sound mind. It's the true elixir for a happy life as it leads to a calm and composed mind to be well-being. Awareness plays a key role in our approach to improve the access of healthcare measure. Different initiatives were carried out through the year to develop awareness in various issues in context of clinical problems among students especially on health and hygiene and which generates the awareness among the students how to control and prevent those undesirable events. Timely access to accurate information and public awareness on prevention methods is one of the feasible interventions in these situations. Identifying level of public awareness on disease prevention is important to mitigate the pandemic.
- **3. The Context:** Health is the biggest wealth. It helps us to enjoy all the little things in life. If one is not healthy, they fail to feel happy. Being unhappy can impact the health of people around us too. The college aims at the development of proper awareness of health and medicinal issues amongst its students to create a bright and healthy future for themselves and for their surroundings. Given their young and unripe years, the students are prone to numerous ill practices, which in turn, might be aggravated by the lack of proper guidance or misconceptions. Different awareness programme of this sort might help them to stay safe and maintain a healthy life. It's very well known that the COVID-19 outbreak has placed unprecedented demands on the health systems of many countries around the globe. In order to develop the causes and consequences various awareness seminars and workshops are conducted throughout the year.

4. The Practice:

i) A SPECIAL CAMP ORGANISED AT SANJOG COMMUNITY HALL, DUTTABAD SLUM AREA

Any special camp has special appeal to the youth as it provides unique opportunity to the students for group activities, collective experience sharing and constant interaction with the community. As part of it, Bidhannagar College NSS Unit organized a Special Camp from 21st March to 27th March, 2023 at Sanjog Community Hall, Duttabad, Ward No. 38, under Bidhannagar Municipal Corporation, District – North 24 Parganas. The objective of our special camp was to raise awareness on current health and social issues, like cancer, AIDS, vector born disease, human trafficking and importance of proper nutrient for child and mother etc. to the slum dwellers. We also organized health /eye checkup camp. All programmes were oriented towards the benefit of the society.

ii) HIV/AIDS AWARENESS PROGRAMME

AIDS is surrounded by misinformed taboos in our society. In order to carry out effective prevention measures and treatment for the infected, it is important to create awareness amongst people. In order to mark World HIV/AIDS Day (1st December) an HIV/AIDS Awareness seminar was organized jointly by the NSS unit, Bidhannagar College and the Department of Education in association with the Rotary Club of Ganga Heritage, District 3291 on **16th December 2022.** Dr. Sumit Poodar, Secretary General of the Association for the Prevention and Control of Rabies in India (APCRI) delivered a lecture on the topic.

5. Evidence of Success:

Bidhannagar College IQAC and NSS unit have a vision and strong commitment towards the service of the society. The said unit is always involved with the activities related to health awareness programmes on different issues on societal life among students. Various awareness programmes were conducted frequently on general health and hygiene, etc.

a) A SPECIAL CAMP ORGANISED AT SANJOG COMMUNITY HALL, DUTTABAD SLUM AREA

On the second day of the camp **CANCER AWARENESS** seminar was organized. **Dr. Ketaki Maitra, Oncologist** addressed the local people about cancer. She emphasized on early symptoms of various cancer like breast, cervices, prostate, lung etc, early diagnosis and treatment regimen and from where they could get low cost treatment. She sensitized the community on not to afraid of cancer as early diagnosis and treatment can cure it. Then there are interactive sessions where Dr. Maitra clears several doubt and myth about cancer.

On 3rd day of the camp **free health and eye checkup** was organized at the community center in association with **Central Calcutta Society for Advancement of Human Development and Research and Susrut Eye Foundation and Research Centre, Salt Lake**. In the camp general physical examination, blood pressure, pulse, general eye checkup, eye power test, colorblindness test etc. were done for the students and local people. Dr. Sabana Roy Choudhury and her associates conducted the heath camp and eye checkup camp was conducted by Samapan Gyen and his team members. Necessary medical advice and precautionary measures were given to the patients. The students were given the task of taking down the details of the people who came for this health check-up and guide the people for the same. The doctors carefully listened to the problems that patients were facing and provided an appropriate solution to cure it. Majority of the people were suffering from chronic joint pain and high blood pressure, diabetes and some have problem in eyes especially in older people. The camp lasted for 5 hours, from 11am to 4pm. More than 100 people attended the camp. Total 28 NSS volunteers and 4 teachers were present.

Next day a Dengue awareness campaign was organized for the local resident. Smt. Urmi Mitra, Assistant Professor, Dept of Zoology explained the symptoms of Dengue Fever, like continuous vomiting, knee pain, stomach pain, head ache, and body pain, and also gave practical awareness about how dengue spread by mosquitoes and how they breeds in Flower pots, Water coolers, Refrigerators, and Wastages. She suggests the participant to be cautious about little stagnant water at anywhere and clear the place for prevention of breeding of areas of mosquitoes. Then Volunteers carried out door to door campaign and distributed leaflet of fact sheet on dengue disease. The awareness camp was really conducive to keep the environment free from Dengue virus. 20 NSS volunteer attended the camp.

On the last day of the camp, we organized a seminar on infant and child feeding. Ms. Mitali Palodhi, Vice president, Indian Dietetic Association was the speaker of the event. She sensitized the participants on the importance of proper nutrient requirement of infant and also for the mother. She also told the importance of Indian traditional food for the development of child. She suggests the participant not to eat fast food, packaged fruit juice, impeded form taking unnecessarily energy drinks. I

b) HIV/AIDS AWARENESS PROGRAMME

Dr. Sumit Poodar with his thorough and lucid explanation of the fundamental aspects of the disease, kept the students captivated. He, in particular, touched a chord by sharing his own personal experiences and his first-hand encounter with the disease. He vividly explained the need for social acceptance and the removal of the stigma for better handling of the disease. The programme was rounded off by a vote of thanks from Dr. Shoumyasree Sen, Head and Associate Professor, Department of Education, Bidhannagar College. There were 101 participants comprising of NSS volunteers, students and faculty members present in this awareness programme.

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
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

1. Title of the Practice (2022-23)

Enrichment Programme on Environmental and Cultural Perception

2. Goal: Environmental and cultural perceptions impart knowledge about the current situation and future prospects of nature.
