1. Title of the Practice (2021-22)

Health awareness programme

- **2. Goal:** Health is an asset that helps us to maintain the balance between the life and sound mind. It's the true elixir for a happy life as it leads to a calm and composed mind to be well-being. Awareness plays a key role in our approach to improve the access of healthcare measure. Different initiatives were carried out through the year to develop awareness in various issues in context of clinical problems among students especially on health and hygiene and which generates the awareness among the students how to control and prevent those undesirable events. The novel corona virus disease 2019 (COVID-19) presents an important and urgent threat to global health at this moments. Timely access to accurate information and public awareness on prevention methods is one of the feasible interventions in these situations. Identifying level of public awareness on disease prevention is important to mitigate the pandemic.
- 3. The Context: Health is the biggest wealth. It helps us to enjoy all the little things in life. If one is not healthy, they fail to feel happy. Being unhappy can impact the health of people around us too. The college aims at the development of proper awareness of health and medicinal issues amongst its students to create a bright and healthy future for themselves and for their surroundings. Given their young and unripe years, the students are prone to numerous ill practices, which in turn, might be aggravated by the lack of proper guidance or misconceptions. Different awareness programme of this sort might help them to stay safe and maintain a healthy life. It's very well known that the COVID-19 outbreak has placed unprecedented demands on the health systems of many countries around the globe. In order to develop the causes and consequences various awareness webinars were conducted throughout this pandemic period.

4. The Practice:

a) Covid 19 Vaccination Camp:

The Coronavirus outbreak has challenged the whole world. Constantly, the experts and authorities are working to develop the vaccines. Therefore, we can also do our bit and adopt preventive measures to limit the spread of this disease. The major goal is to get the vaccine to everyone so that we can go on and about with our normal lives. A COVID Vaccine Certificate (CVC) issued by the government offers an assurance to the beneficiary on the vaccination, type of vaccine used, and the provisional certificate also provides the next vaccination due. It also is an evidence for the citizen to prove to any entities which may require proof of vaccination. Vaccination not only protects individuals from disease, but also reduces their risk of spreading the virus. Therefore, there could be a requirement in future to produce certificate for certain kind of social interactions and international travel. A Vaccination camp was organised in the college campus to get the students and the staff vaccinated either 1st dose or 2nd dose with prior registration or spot registration, October 4, 2021 with the help of Bidhannagar Sub Division Hospital.

b) Thalassaemia Awareness Webinar, Camp and Thalassaemia Screening

Thalassemia is one of the silent assassins of our society. As a disease it is well-nigh incurable and brings limitless misery to the sufferer as well as to their family. Yet, a few simple steps are enough to prevent this disease and to eradicate the curse from the face of our planet. All we need is to be aware. A programme on Thalassemia awareness is, therefore, a regular fixture in our NSS programme calendar. This year, in spite of the pandemic-induced lockdown, we managed to organize a webinar on this theme. It was held on the 27th of July, 2021 on the Zoom platform, in collaboration with the Thalassemia Awareness and Prevention Committee, Rotary International District 3291. The webinar started at 5p.m. on the said date. The meeting was graced by the presence of Sri Prabir Chatterjee, District Governor of Rotary International District 3291, other dignitaries from the institute, and Sri Tapomay Das, Officer-in-Charge of Bidhannagar College. A Thalassemia Awareness Camp also was held on 6th April 2022. This year's awareness camp, like last year, was held in collaboration with the Thalassemia Awareness and Prevention Committee, Rotary Club of Ganga Heritage, Rotary International District 3291. Several members of the club were present as dignitaries. The chief speaker in the programme was Dr. Ramendu Homchaudhuri. Dr. Homchaudhuri, a veteran in this field, spoke elaborately and lucidly on the three simple steps that need to be followed for Thalassemia eradication, viz. testing oneself, testing one's prospective spouse before marriage and a test during pregnancy if both the partners are carriers. His address was punctuated by anecdotes and real life cases that he has experienced in his long career dealing with this disease. Following the awareness camp held on the day before, a Thalassemia screening camp was held in the college premises on 7th April 2022.

5. Evidence of Success:

Bidhannagar College IQAC and NSS unit have a vision and strong commitment towards the service of the society. The said unit is always involved with the activities related to health awareness programmes on different issues on societal life among students. Various awareness programmes were conducted frequently on general health and hygiene, etc.

a) Covid 19 Vaccination Camp:

Bidhannagar College in association with the Sub Divisional Hospital, Bidhannagar organized COVID -19 vaccinations Camp on 4th October 2021 in the College Campus. Vaccination was done by the Nursing and Technical staff members of the Hospital. During the camp, 46 staff and students of the College got vaccinated with Covishield vaccine. Among them 11 got first dose and 35 vaccinated by second dose. Teaching, Non –Teaching staff and students of the College helped generously to the smooth conduct of the camp. Officer–in –Charge, Mr Tapamoy Das, expressed his gratitude to the doctors and the supporting staff of the Sub Division Hospital Bidhnanagar for this Vaccination camp.

b) Thalassaemia Awareness Camp and Thalassaemia Screening

During the Webinar after brief addresses were followed by a lecture by the Chief Speaker of the event, Dr. Ramendu Homchaudhur. Dr. Homchaudhuri, a veteran in this field, spoke elaborately and lucidly on the three simple steps that need to be followed for Thalassemia eradication, viz. testing oneself, testing one's prospective spouse before marriage and a test during pregnancy if both the partners are carriers. His address was punctuated by anecdotes and real life cases that he has experienced in his long career dealing with this disease. A total of 112 participants, inclusive of students (80) and teachers, listened to the programme online and were immensely benefitted. IN the Camp on offline mode the students, teachers and nonteaching staff of the college attended the programme. The students and teachers interacted with the qualified medical practitioners sent by the Haematology Department of the NRSMedical College, Kolkata regarding Thalassemia and the students enjoyed thoroughly the seminar and they learned a lot about the subject. Around 80 students and 32 teachers were present in the programme. Following the awareness camp held on the day before, a Thalassemia screening campwas held in the college premises on 7th April 2022. More than hundred screenings — 96 students and 7 teachers — were done by able and qualified medical practitioners sent by the Hematology Department of the NRSMedical College, Kolkata.

1. Title of the Practice (2021-22)

Enrichment Programme on Environmental and Cultural Perception

2. Goal: Environmental and cultural perceptions impart knowledge about the current situation and future prospects of nature. It teaches people to explore all the problems related to environment, and engage in wise ways of preserving it. Environmental awareness programme to educate people with a notion "GO GREEN." In this modern era, people are educated, but they are unaware regarding the destruction of mother earth..The objectives of environmental education is to gain awareness, knowledge, attitudes, skills and capacity building: Participation.

Cultural awareness helps us break down cultural barriers, build cultural bridges, and learn how to love, and appreciate those different from us. We can relate better to people with cultural differences as we begin to understand ourselves better. These results in more cultural connection and less cultural conflict. Culture includes what people actually do and what they believe. Culture influences greatly how we see the world, how we try to understand it and how we communicate with each other. 3. The Context:

Inter departmental Cultural Competition was organized by Cultural Committee, Bidhannagar College on Rabindra Sangeet/ Nazrul geeti/ Atulprasad/ Rajanikanta/ Dwijendrageeti, Bangla Adhunik, Instrumental (Rabindra Sangeet), Classical Dance, Contemporary Dance, Recitation, Extempore and Debate on 12th and 13th April 2022.
